

## Sustaining Academic Growth through Stakeholders Contribution

The Institution's commitment to holistic development, deeply rooted in the unwavering support of its stakeholders, has been distinctly marked by financial contributions since its inception. In the early phase, the local community supported the College's financial needs, until a philanthropist Mr. J. Thankima donated Rs. 5 lakhs and land for the first campus. This spirit of giving has since extended to faculty and staff, who routinely go beyond their professional duties to contribute financially and otherwise.

Faced with limited state funding, faculty members have actively supported various student activities, including annual sports, university and state level competitions, department-wise study tours and field visit as well as equipment procurement through financial contributions. Notably, they collectively donated Rs. 8 lakhs to resolve a legal dispute regarding new campus site allotment.

Infrastructural advancements have also been bolstered by faculty contributions, such as the donation of Rs. 5,80,770 lakhs for extension of classrooms to support RUSA schemes. To undergo NAAC assessments, the staff twice donated one day salary and additional Rs. 60,000/- to cover expenses. For maintenance of campus, the have donated Rs. 1,94,210/- during the past years, Additionally, three departments employ Voluntary Teachers to address faculty shortages, with their remuneration funded by departmental faculty contributions. These actions reflect the remarkable commitment of the Institution's stakeholders to fostering a thriving academic environment and ensuring sustainable growth.
