BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

The quest for quality education easily accessible to the youth of the communities of Bawngkawn and Durtlang, as well as Mizoram, was the foundation that resulted in the establishment of Government. J. Thankima College. The community of Durtlang established Lalhmingthanga College in 1992 and J. Thankima College was established in 1993 by the community of Bawngkawn. In 2002, the two private Colleges were amalgamated and thereupon upgraded to a deficit status by the Government of Mizoram with the nomenclature 'L&J College' and then as 'J.Thankima College'. The Institution was provincialized in 2007 by the Government of Mizoram and was renamed 'Government J. Thankima College'.

Government J. Thankima College has attained a 'C++' grade in the 1st Cycle (2007) and 'C' grade in the 2nd Cycle (2016) of assessment and accreditation by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council, Bangalore. For the 3rd cycle, the College attained A+ with CGPA of 3.31 which is the highest ever score amongst all the Government Colleges within Mizoram.

The College is permanently affiliated to the MZU in 2007 and registered under section 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act of 1956 in 2008 and subsequently received financial assistances under the various schemes of the University Grants Commission since then. The College has also been selected as Model Degree College under RUSA 2.0 scheme.

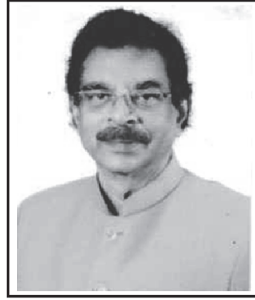

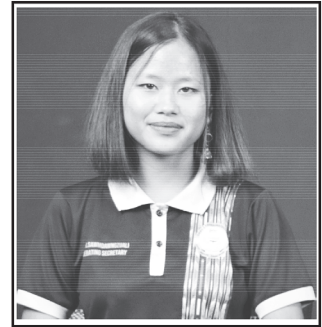

ACADEMIC AND INFRASTRUCTURAL DEVELOPMENT REPORT 2022-2023

I am delighted and fortunate to report the development of the College during 2022-2023 in various fields. These developments are the result of the collective and untiring efforts of all the staff of this college.

For the first time in history of the College, students' enrollment crossed a 1,000 mark during 2021-22 with a total enrolment of 1028. During the academic session 2022-23, we admitted 1065 students and this is the highest number of enrolment since the establishment of the College

A. ACADEMIC MATTER:

A.1. Mou signed with other HEIs: In recognition of mutual benefits and scholastic interaction with other Higher Education Institutions (HEIs), the College signed the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) other Colleges as under

- A.3. NAAC accreditation process:** The College NAAC accreditation expires on 15th September, 2021. As such, the College prepares with all its capabilities for the 3rd cycle of Assessment from all corners. The College successfully uploaded its Self-Study Report (SSR) to the NAAC portal on 31st March, 2022. After going through the Students Satisfaction Survey (SSS) and Data Validation and Verification (DVV) process, the NAAC Peer team comprising of Prof. Shyama Nand Singh as Chairman, Prof. Ashok Hanjagi as member Coordinator and Dr. Badal Kumar Sen as member visited the College during 15-16 December, 2022. The result of the Assessment is declared on 20.12.2022 and the College is awarded A+ with CGPA score of 3.31 which is valid for 5 years. The College score is the highest among all the State Government Colleges in Mizoram.
- A.4. AQAR Report submitted:** The submission of AQAR is essential at the NAAC Portal for every academic session. The Report is successfully submitted.
- A.5. Award distribution:** In order to encourage students in their academic achievements, '*HoD Award*' is awarded annually as per College rules. The HoD award is distributed to the following students on the 7th June, 2023 at the Farewell Dinner Party @ Multipurpose Hall, Berawtlang, Aizawl.

A.6. Smart Board: Smart board is installed in all the class rooms under RUSA 2.0 grant of the College. These smart boards are very useful in delivering quality lectures and are useful to improve the Teaching Learning process of students.

A.7. Minor Research Project: Prof. JV. Nunchunga as the Project Director and Dr. Lalrinkimi Pachuau and Dr. Lalrinnggheta as the Co- Project Directors applied for a Minor Research project at Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR), New Delhi with a Project entitled 'Analysis of Socio-Economic and Political Impact of Member of Legislative Assembly Local Area Development Scheme (MLALADS) on Mizoram'. The same is approved by the ICSSR with a total amount of Rs. 3,55,700(Three lakh fifty thousand and seven hundred only) vide sanction No. F. No. 02/47/ST/2022-23/ICSSR/ RP/ MN, Dated New Delhi, the 29th March, 2023.

A.8. Constitution of new committees:

D degree and One teacher Alexius Lalchhandama, Department of Management was also awarded M.Phil degree.

- B.1. Construction of SU Office:** The SU Office building which is under construction is continued from the donation of students and SU Fund.
- B.2. MoU with Durtlang Taekwondo Club:** For physical and mental fitness, the College signed an MoU with Durtlang Taekwondo Club wherein the students are entitle to avail 50% discount in training fee.
- B.3. MoU with RIDA Dental:** To provide necessary dental services to the students and staff, an MoU is signed between Rida Dental Clinic. As per the MoU, students and staff are entitled to receive 20% discount in oral treatment except orthodontic and cosmetic treatment.
- B.4. MoU with BD. Optical:** For the purpose of providing free eye vision services/ care to the students and staff, an MoU is signed with BD. Optical, Aizawl. Students and staff are entitle to avail 10-30% discount on purchase of spectacles from the Shop
- B.5. NCC Army wing:** The 1st Mizo NCC Battalion allocated NCC (Army Wing) with Cadet capacity of 100 Boys and 50 Girls.
- B.6. Study Tour:** A sum of Rs. 2,50,000 is received from Directorate of Higher & Technical Education. Allocation of fund, place and duration of the visits by departments are as under.

B.7. Compliant Officer: Pu Lalthlamuana, Vice principal is appointed as the Compliant Officer relating to violation of the provision of the Transgender Persons (Protection of Rights) Act, 2019

B.8. Grievance Redressal Officer: In pursuance of the Section 23(1) of Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, Pu Lalthlamuana, Vice principal is appointed for Grievance Redressal Officer.

B.9. Insurance of students: The Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana (PMSBY) is an accidental insurance scheme that provides one year of accidental death and disability coverage with an annual renewal. With the minimum premium rate of Rs. 12/- per annum, the policy assured Rs. 2 lakhs for the accidental demise and permanent total disability and Rs.1 lakh for permanent partial disability. As many as willing 95 students subscribed the policy and the premium is given from the SAF account of the College.

B.10. Helping the needy students: A sum of Rs. 2000/- each is given to three students who need financial support for purchase of study materials. Apart from this, a sum of Rs. 1674/- is used for meeting student's medical expenses from SAF account of the College.

C. INFRASTRUCTURE REPORT:

C.1. Construction of Retaining Wall: As requested, a sum of Rs. 7,80,000 is allocated by PWD for construction of Retaining Wall just below the RUSA 2.0 Academic Building to prevent landslide. The work is executed by the College

C.2. Extension of Waiting shed: The Students' Waiting shed at the Block III of the College Central is extended to accommodate more students and nearby commuters.

C.3. Ground Water drilling: As the demand for water is increasing day by day in the College, proposal/ application is submitted to the Directorate for drilling of Ground Water. The Directorate arranged a sum of Rs. 2,50,000 for this purpose. Drilling work will be pursued as the permission is granted by the Concerned PHE Department.

C.4. Solar Plant: A sum of Rs. 2,63,000 is received from Finance Department for purchase of 10kWp Solar plant to support Teaching leaning devices in the class rooms.

C.5. Submission of projects: The following proposal are submitted to the Government under various funding agencies

ü Rs. 8,00,46,000/- for construction of additional class rooms at NEC

ü Rs. 99,99,000/- for Auditorium at Ministry of Tribal Affairs Department.

ü Rs.19,40,000 at Mizoram PWD under SASCI scheme

ü Rs. 9,67,19,000 and Rs. 1,59,36,000 for construction of Auditorium and Library respectively under PMJVK scheme

ü Rs. 1,50,00,000 at the State Social Welfare & Tribal Affairs Department for construction of PwD friendly amenities.

D. CAMPUS BEAUTIFICATION:

D.1. Tree Planting: Plantlets, collected from Forest, Environment and Climate Change Department and donations from staff are planted inside the three campuses during the rainy seasons of 2022 and 2023.

D.2. Green Campus Day: The College Green Campus day was observed on 2nd June, 2022. Plantlets of different trees/ flowers are planted at the College campus.

E. THE COLLEGE ADOPTED VILLAGE: Apart from taking various steps for the College Adapted Village, Nausel, the College prepared and published the book entitle 'Aspects of Nausel Village' on 5th December, 2022 containing 91 pages. The Book dealt with various aspects like Memoires of Nausel, Geographical, Historical, Administrative, Socio-Economic, Health of Women and Children, Educational, Agricultural Marketing, Practice and Traditions of Nausel Village.

IMPLEMENTATION OF 2ND CYCLE NAAC PEER TEAM RECOMMENDATIONS

- Upgradation of faculty qualification:** The Institution makes systematic efforts to upgrade the qualification of the faculty members. In adhering to NAAC Peer Team Recommendation. 13 faculty members acquired research degree and 11 faculties are pursuing research during 2016 – 2021.

- **Infrastructure Development:** The College developed and augmented physical infrastructure to meet the growing demands of the student-intake. The College has three plots of land viz. Central Campus at Bawngkawn Brigade, Southern Campus at Bawngkawn and Northern Campus at Durtlang. The Central Campus houses the Administrative Office, Academic Building, College Library and Canteen. The Northern Campus houses the Boy's Hostel and Indoor Sports Training Facility. The Southern Campus houses the Women's Hostel and Warden's quarters.
- **Systematic Student Support Service:** Mentoring System was Introduced to guide the career choice of the students and cater to their various needs. Entrepreneurship Knowledge Cell (EKC-MEDMOC) was set up for skills development. Career Counselling Centre is set up and various capacity building programmes on career focus have been organized.
- **Offered career focus add-on courses:** The College introduced three add-on courses viz. Spoken English Class, Personality Development Course (PDC) and Course on Computer Concepts (CCC). It set up Computer Study Centre in collaboration with NIELIT Aizawl Centre.
- **Conduct of Remedial Classes:** Remedial classes are systematically conducted for the Slow Learners and Back-log students and logbooks are maintained.
- **Promotion of Research Culture:** Felicitation program was organized for faculty who completed research degree. Staff Welfare Association recognized 6 faculty who acquired Ph. D degree with a cash incentive of Rs. 5000/- each and citation. In addition, Research Consultancy Committee awarded 13 faculty with a cash incentive of Rs. 3000/- each.
- **Introduced job-oriented course:** New academic courses viz., Management Department and Geography Department are introduced on self-financing basis. Nine faculties are recruited which currently manage these departments.
- **Expedite and sustain the College reputation:** The College organized various programmes like State Level Management Tech Meet 2018, Talent Expo 2019, Annual College Week, Cultural Day, National Cadet Corps

(NCC) Drill, Adventure Club Basic Training, State Level Emergency Mock Drill etc. Poster making competition, article and poetry writing competition, competition in various sports disciplines were also organized at Campus.

- **Effective NSS & Community outreach programmes:** NSS and Red Ribbon Club organized various programmes like special camping, blood donation camp/campaign, HIV/AIDS awareness campaign, tree plantation, cleanliness drive etc. Women Committee and Internal Complaints Committee also organized various gender sensitization programmes. National Green Corps (Eco Club) initiated several environmental awareness, green programmes and observed International/ National Environmental important days.
- **Intensified ICT thrust in teaching-learning:** The College has integrated ICT in teaching-learning system. It has developed 16 classrooms well equipped with ICT facilities. Most of the classroom teachings are delivered through ICT power point presentation.
- **Increase number of Computer:** The College library, administrative office, computer centre and language Laboratory are well equipped with 60 Desktop Computers. The central campus is equipped with a fast free Wi-Fi internet connection.
- **Functional and Vibrant IQAC:** The IQAC has rejuvenated in maximizing its potential to formulate the academic plans and developments. It prepares the annual academic plan and monitor through meetings, reports of various departments, committees/cells, etc. Forty-eight (48) files are opened for correspondence of Department, Cells/ Committees and Administrative office.
- **Structured feedback mechanism, analysis and follow-up action:** The institution formulates structured mechanism to obtain feedback from various stakeholders viz. Students, Alumni, Parents, Employers and Teachers to improve the quality of teaching-learning. Each department conducted meetings to follow up action.
- **Pursue perspective plan and deployment:** The College formulates perspective plan for long term and short term in considering the College vision and mission which is deployed during the reporting period. The stakeholders viz. students, teachers, alumni and staffs are

IQAC CONTRIBUTIONS TO QUALITY ASSURANCE STRATEGIES AND PROCESSES IN THE OPERATION OF THE INSTITUTION

- **Formulates action plan:** The IQAC formulates the Action Plan of the institution at the beginning of every academic session. The Action Plan covers enhancement of the teaching-learning processes, infrastructural development, resource mobilization, timely submission of AQAR reports as well as conducting feedbacks from stakeholders.
- **Conduct regular meeting:** Periodic meetings and Review meetings of the IQAC has been convened to monitor, review and appraise the action taken against the Action Plan and activities undertaken by various departments, committees and cells.
- **Decentralization in decision making:** The IQAC has been instrumental in fostering internalization of quality through decentralization in decision making. Various committees, cells and teams were formed with specific areas of autonomy, major activities and decisions effecting the operations of the institution were taken up and made in the meetings.
- **Promoting research culture:** As the main unit in fostering quality development of the teachers, the IQAC has been promoting research culture by exhorting the teaching faculty to mobilize resources from various funding agencies for research activities for personal as well as professional development. The IQAC organizes workshops/seminars

and a provision for cash incentive has been made to the faculty enrolled in research programme and those acquiring research degrees.

- **Conduct various feedback:** To ensure quality in teaching-learning and extra/co-curricular activities, feedbacks from the stake holders viz. student, alumni, teacher, employer and parent were collected. The feedbacks were analyzed confidentially and the summary of the feedbacks were displayed in the Institution's website. Teachers and departments were appraised according to the feedbacks and plans were formulated to address any shortcomings of the Institution reflected through the feedbacks.
- **Conduct programmes and add-on courses:** The IQAC is the major unit of the institution that provides curricular/co-curricular and extracurricular activities to augment classroom learning, facilitating the gaining of knowledge and acquiring life skills. Hence, various seminars, workshops, training, seminars as well as talks in observance of national and international days have been organized.
- **Financial support and welfare schemes:** The Institution makes a policy of financial supports and provide welfare schemes to the staff and students. Staff Welfare Association has been established to enhance cooperation among the staff and providing monetary support through loans to the members. It also provides financial support to the staff for attending seminar/workshop/training etc. There is also a provision of Student Aid Fund, which can be availed by students of limited resources.
- **Green initiatives and eco-friendly campus:** Green initiatives are undertaken by organizing talks, environmental workshop, activities through Eco Club, NSS and Beautification Committee. MoUs are signed with Karo Sambhav Private Limited for e-waste collection and collaborates with MPCB and AMC for green initiatives and dry waste management.
- **Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA):** To enhance the overall quality of the institution, The IQAC has taken initiative in auditing the academic and administrative conduct. On the basis of the Academic and Administrative Audit conducted by duly constituted Team of Assessors, the College has attained 65% with an aggregate Institutional point 974.
- **3rd Cycle NAAC Peer Team Visit:** The IQAC has taken initiative in the process of the 3rd Cycle NAAC Peer Team visit in assessing the institutional **accreditation**. Based on the Institutional Self Study Report (SSR) submitted to NAAC HEIs Portal and a detailed observations report of NAAC Peer Team Visit which was held on 15th to 16th December, 2022, the National Assessment and Accredited Council (NAAC) declared

BRIEF REPORT OF RUSA 2022



Lalngaihawma, Institutional Coordinator

Introduction:

In a country with diverse higher education space, centrally funded institutions receive generous funding from the Centre but have a limited coverage in terms of enrolment. UGC mandate allows it to fund only a limited number of institutions that are UGC Section 12(B) and 2(f) compliant. Out of the 384 State universities only 182 State universities are eligible for central assistance, which leaves a significant number of colleges and universities not eligible for UGC grants.

At the same time, UGC is also not allowed to channelize funds through the State Government or any other entity other than Institutions. Thus, States often complained about being unaware of the development funds that come to the State Funded Institutions from Centre, making planning and funding very difficult for States. Hence, there was a need to establish a new institutional mechanism, which would make every stakeholder a partner in the process of higher education transformation. The strategic intervention came through a Centrally Sponsored Scheme called RUSA, which has a completely new approach towards funding State higher education Institutions. The allocation of funds under RUSA is based on well-defined norms & parameters and linked to academic, administrative and governance reforms, while future grants are performance based and outcome dependent. The reforms initiated under RUSA aim to build a self-sustaining momentum to for greater accountability and autonomy of State institutions and impress upon them the need to improve the quality of education.

Component Wise Funding :

As envisaged in RUSA Guidelines, there were 16 components, each component has unique target for funding. Among other colleges, our college also has received fund from Ministry of Education under component 6 : Upgradation of Existing Colleges to Model Degree Colleges. The important objectives of this component of funding is setting up requisite infrastructures like class rooms, library, laboratory, faculty rooms, toilets blocks and other essential requirements with technological advanced facilities. The Component has a package of fund Rs. 4 Crore. The under mentioned are item wise fund utilized by our college under the scheme of Component 6 of Upgradation of Existing Colleges to Model Degree College (MDC).

Inauguration of RUSA.2.0 Academic Building:

RUSA 2.0 Academic Building was inaugurated by Hon'ble Higher & Technical Education Minister, Dr. H. Lalthangliana on 29th July 2022. The project is funded under RUSA 2.0 of Component 6 of Upgradation of Existing Colleges to Model Degree Colleges with an estimated cost of Rs. 160 lakh constructed by Mizoram Technocrat Pvt. Limited. The building was housed by 4 classrooms, 1 seminar hall, 1 storeroom and separate toilets for boys and girls at the two floors.



Purchase of Equipment:

20% of the fund received by the institution through RUSA 2.0 Component 6 of Upgradation of Existing Colleges to Model Degree College was reserved for the purchase of equipment directly or indirectly benefited by the students for enhancing capacity in all spheres. During 2022, the institution has procured various Equipments / facilities for the promotion and maintaining and enhancement of equity, equality and accessibility within the campus. System used for transaction of RUSA Funds :

The Govt. of India has introduced a new mechanism for maintaining transaction of funds known as Public Financial Management System (PFMS) in 2009 and RUSA begin to transact fund through this system on 2020. The main objective of introducing PFMS is minimizing and elimination intermediaries between the Institutions and vendors and preventing misuse of public money. Through this system, the institution directly transfer funds

to the vendors known as direct benefit transfer. All transaction of funds by the institution can be accessed and monitored by higher authority at the state level. This system of transaction of funds was also back by maintain of Cash book (Double Entry), Asset Register, Sanction Orders and Certified Vouchers.

In addition, the state Government has issued order in 2021 that all transactions of funds should be done through State Nodal Agency (SNA) Account – Additional State Project Director (RUSA), and informed the institution transfer all the unspent fund to SNA Account. Since then, the institution did not maintain separate account of RUSA fund and therefore the institution was required to seek prior approval for undertaking transaction of fund.

Conclusion : As envisaged in the guidelines of NEP 2020, increase of Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) in higher education is one of the main components. This further requires enhancement of infrastructures of various types for accommodating more inputs. In this scenario, RUSA had played a central role for providing funds for building various types of infrastructures that we are availing today. Presently, the institution utilizing funds of RUSA 2.0 and began to reach the end of time line. It is highly expect to materialize RUSA 3.0 in the near future.

the students , C.Vanlalruati , Chairperson of Anti-Drug Club GJTC was appointed as Nodal Officer from the college.

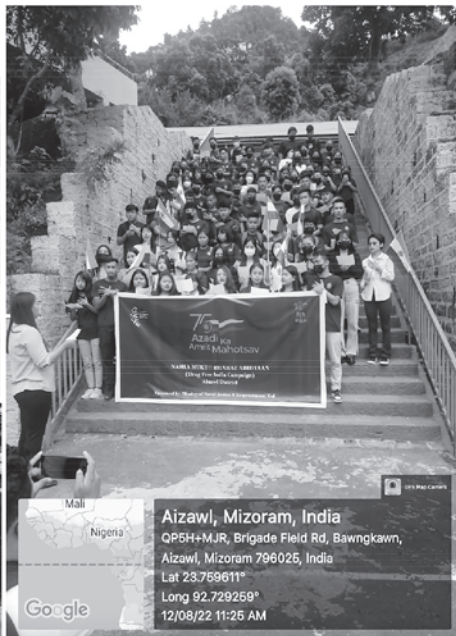
Activities:

The activities undertaken by the NSS GJTC can be grouped into Regular Activities (RA) and Special Camping. Prominent activities under RA were:

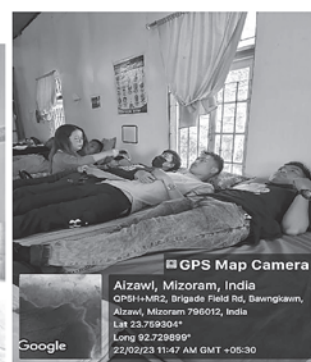

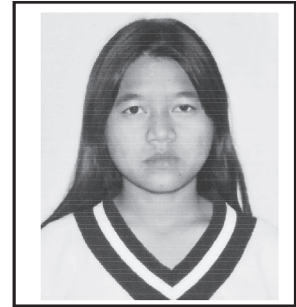
- Fund was raised through selling of pickles, lassi, wai wai for a week within the College Campus.

Financial Literacy hi kan mamawh em?

Tichuan, Labour market kan tih ah te hian thiamna (Skills) hi a rawn pawimawh zual chho zel a, hlawh nawlpui tehna leh lak dan ah pawh zirna sang zawk a zir chhuak te leh a sang vak lemlo te ah pawh inthliarna te pawh a rawn pianpui a. chungchang ah te, budgeting kan tih leh kan sum peipun (investing) lamah te hian Financial Literacy hian a huam vek mai a ni. Financial Decision tha kan neih leh neih loh hi kan Financial Literacy level ah a in nghtat em em a, thil pawimawh tak mai chu, mihring nawlpui hian engti chen in nge Finance lamah hriatchian zualna kan neih a, engin nge kan hriatthiamna hian Financial Decision ah min puih theih ang tih hi zawhna pawimawh tak niin a lang.

Financial Decision tha zawk leh remchang zawk kan neih theih nan hian thil pathum, pawimawh tak hi kan hriat ngai a awm a, heng thil pathum te hi khawvel pum mai economic ah hian a zawmpui vek mai a, “The Big Three” tih hialin an sawi a, Financial Literacy teh nan leh zir chian nana an hman kailawn pawl ber a ni ta ani. Chung thil pathum te chu han sawi dawn ila –

- 1). A hmasa ber ah chuan “Numeracy” kan tih hi a ni a, hei hi interest rate leh interest compounding kan chhut chhuah theih na tura thiamna leh hriatthiamna kan neih na hi a ni.

Financial Literacy tha in min zirtir a tum ber a te chu mipui nawlpui in kan sum hman te, kan khawl dan te, kan hmuh dan te, kan puk na chungchang ah te leh kan dahthat na leh dahthat dan chungchang ah te a ni. Mi tam tak hian kan sum enkawl dan chungchang ah, entirnan – savings ah te, insurance ah te, real estate kan tih te, zirna chungchang a investment kan neih te,

budgeting ah te, leh tax kalphung chungchang ah te hriatthiamna leh thuthluk siamna mumal leh tha zawk kan duh in kan mamawh vek a, chu chu Financial Literacy hian a rawn tum ber chu niin a lang ani. Ti hian sawi ta ila –

- Financial Literate kan nih chuan mahni inrintawkna (confidence) tha min pe a, kan nun kal zel tura thuthlukna siam chungchang ah confidence tha tawk min pe thei bawk a ni.
- Kan sum peipunna (financial investment) chungchang ah te investment strategy tha zawk te min pe thei bawk a ni. Entirna pakhat ah chuan, mi pakhat in a financial objective chu a sum neih thenkhat te stock market ah invest in, nakin zel a retirement savings ah te a hman thei a ni.

Sustainability in Consumption

1. What is consumption?

Consumption, in a broad sense, refers to consuming something. Consumption is an essential term in economics, referring to products and services consumed by households. Global economic indicators such as GDP (gross domestic product), or household expenditure utilize the term consumption. Consumption is interlinked with production, as all production is inherently dependent on the fact that we, consumers, have a need and a want to consume.

2. Who is a consumer?

The countless consumption processes that take place during our everyday lives make us consumers. As consumers, we are part of an economic system. That means that there are two core sides/components/factors to look at: the consumer and the economic system itself. Those sides are interdependent as they interact and affect each other.

3. Why do we consume?

Our wish to consume doesn't only come from the need to satisfy a physical or physiological need like food, shelter and more. We consume to create and shape our identities. Consumption is a big part of our psychological and social lives. We are, first and foremost, consumers.

4. What do we consume?

We, humans, spend most of our time consuming something. We consume food, energy, but also information and data. Here are a couple of examples:

a. MEAT: On average, in European countries, between 50 to 100 kg of meat is consumed per person per year. With a few exceptions of countries such as

China and Vietnam, the average meat consumption per person per year in Europe is at least 50 times more than the average consumption in African and Asian countries.

b. **FASHION:** The fashion industry is considered one of the largest industrial polluters in the world, contributing to approximately 10% of global pollution. Each production step in the fashion industry demands water, energy, material and chemical use, with the latter being regarded as potentially harmful to the environment, the production workers, and even to the consumers (Niinimäki et al., 2020).

c. **ENERGY:** The total energy consumption per capita has increased dramatically between the 1960s to 1970s, and have been approximately 150 gigajoules (GJ) per capita until 2015 (Saundry, 2019). Oil and natural gas resources comprise the bulk of the resources for energy consumption (European Environment Agency, 2009)

d. **MOBILITY:** Within urban cities, Europeans would travel between 3.8 to 15.8 km. This pertains to areas meant for work, recreation or social services (Jacobs-Crisioni et al., 2015).

“Europe is the global leader in international tourism, with over 600 million foreign tourists arriving in the region each year.” (Statista, 2020)

e. **DATA:** Regarding data, we consume 34 GB of data and information every day, which equals approximately 100.000 words.

5. Impact of our consumption: understanding ‘production systems’

From the examples of how the consumers’ behaviour has changed over time, we can clearly see that we consume too much. This amount is disproportionate in comparison with the Earth’s resources, which are not infinite. Through consumption, we use these resources without realizing their finiteness and ability to regenerate. Furthermore, we consume things that are not produced to last due to poorer quality, to keep the production cost per unit as low as possible, leading to further consumption. In addition, what we consume can often come from production processes that are coupled with negative environmental as well as social impacts.

To understand how increasing consumption leads to unsustainability, we should understand the concept of 'production systems.' Production systems refer to the system of converting starting materials to end products. It generally consists of three elements: inputs, conversion process, and output. For example, a mixture of flour, sugar, oil, eggs and yeast (inputs) would be baked (conversion process) to create bread (output). Due to advances in production systems, we could conveniently and cheaply avail of products to make us healthy, safe and comfortable (Holstein and Tenenbaum, 2020). However, we are unaware of the magnitude of production systems involved in producing the products that we regularly consume. We do not see that in order to conveniently and cheaply avail these products, a great number of resources have to be utilized in large scale production processes of the products. In addition, these processes also generate a lot of waste products.

6. The power of consumers

In classic economic understanding, products are produced because there is a certain demand. That gives us as consumers power to influence which products are being produced. With every buying decision we make, we express a preference about what kind of products we desire and what kind of products will be produced in future. Producers, on the other hand, can recognize trends in our consumer behaviour and can develop new innovative products that correspond to those preferences trends and stimulate further consumption. This way, producers and consumers can influence each other and can inspire each other to become more sustainable (in the sense of the Brundtland definition). It is therefore up to us consumers to rethink our consumption decisions and, in the sense of a sustainable economy, to use our buying power strategically.

7. How to consume more sustainably?

There are no simple and sweeping answers to this, but many different and sometimes efficient solutions, such as opting for:

Examples of changes in consumption and climate savings (Lund University, 2017)

- i. Organic or fair certified food.
- ii. fashion made from recycled materials.
- iii. cosmetics that have not been tested on animals and are unpackaged, or
- iv. sharing-platforms for tools or vehicles.

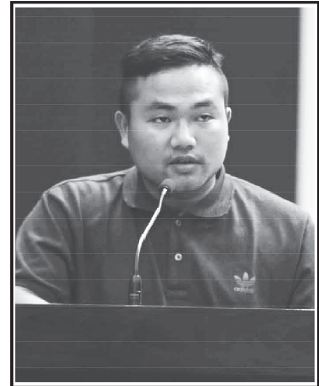

Chuvang in mahni irawm chhuak a lemchan thawnthu ziah tha tak hi kan nei tam lova, kan uar hek lo. Heti lam a thangharh a, kan thuziak mi ten ngaihtuahna an sen pawh a hi a ngai viau ni in a lang.

Heng kan sawi tak Mizo lemchan hmahlir hrang hrang te hi tihlawhtling thei tur chuan hnam anga kan tanrual angai a, lemchan bikah phei chuan pian nawn leh ngai kan ni ti ila kan sawi sual awm lo ve. Tha leh zung tam tak senga bul min tansaktute thachhang dawltu ni thei tura kan inchherhriam a tul tak zet a ni. *Literature* zet huang khat chauha hmasawn mai lo va, lemchan lamah pawh khawvel ruala ke pen ve thei tura kan inpuahchah a hun hle tawh a ni. Chumi tur chuan ziak mi leh chhiar tu te, zirtu leh zirtirtu te thleng a tanrual a, *Liiterature* peng hrang hrang te ti hmasawn tur a kan thawh ho hi a pawimawh ber a ni.

Centre-State Relations in India: Problems and Challenges

Abstract

Nation states (Countries) in the world can be broadly categorized into two- Unitary states and Federal states. A unitary state is one where the entire administration of the country is exclusively wielded by centralized political set up and the ultimate authority rest with the same. Whereas, in federal states due to various reasons like security, economic interest and geographical factors different political set up in different regions came up to form a larger union comprising of all those regions accepting the agreement made. These regions while retaining their power, surrendered to the union some important power to keep the union integrated. Thus, in federal states, centre (union) and states (region/local/canton/unit) relations emerged as one of the important political and economic issues.

Keywords: Federalism, controversy, autonomy, coalition

In 2019, Delhi Chief Minister and Aam Admi Party founder Arvind Kejriwal had a fierce battle with Lt. Governor Najib Jung on the issue of official appointment. Also, in Arunachal Pradesh, Governor Jyoti Prasad Rajkhowa recommended imposition of President's rule in the state on ground of breakdown of constitutional machinery in the state. As a result, President's rule was imposed on 26th January 2016 by the President, Pranab Mukherji under article 356(1). But it was lifted on 19th February 2016 as recommended by the Supreme Court.

The above two cases proved the still existing controversial role of Governor in the state till today. In Delhi, Aam Admi Party formed government and in Arunachal Pradesh it was Congress in power. Meanwhile, BJP under the coalition alliances of NDA is the party in power at the centre. This further

proved that not only Indian National Congress but also Bharatya Janata Party was responsible for misusing this gubernatorial post.

One of the latest events which marred Indian democracy in general and Indian federalism in particular is experienced in Karnataka after the state assembly election votes were counted on 15th May, 2018. After the result of 222 contested seats became known, no single party was in a position to form government in the state. A party or a coalition needed support of 112 members to have simple majority in the house. The BJP turned out to be single largest party with 104 seats, with eight short of a majority. Congress which won 78 seats extended unconditional support to Janata Dal (Secular) with a 37 seats to form and head the government. Three independents completed the picture. Both the BJP and JD(S)-Congress met the Governor and staked their claims.

The State Governor surprisingly invited BS Yeddyurappa, leader of the single largest party BJP, to form the government, though there was absolutely no evidence of him having the sufficient numbers. Fifteen days were provided (Yeddyurappa requested for one week) to prove majority on the floor of house. The Congress-JD(s) challenged the Governor's decision before the Supreme Court. Their main prayers were to set aside the Governor's invitation to Yeddyurappa, stay his swearing-in and advancement of the floor test. They also challenged the appointment of the Pro-tem Speaker by the Governor. The Supreme Court refused to stay the swearing-in but ordered an immediate floor test. Since pursuing the challenge against the appointment of the Pro-tem Speaker would have delayed the floor test, the court as a pacifying measure ordered a live telecast of the floor-test. Yeddyurappa resigned just before the floor test and the rest of the story is well-known¹.

This incident manifests how the role of state governor is so important. Had the recommendations made by the Punchhi Commission of appointing only those person as governor who has not taken too great a part in politics generally and particularly in the recent past being followed, problem like this may not be experienced. Vajubhai Rudabhai Vala is an Indian politician and

the Governor of the state of Karnataka in India since September 2014. He was a member of Bharatiya Janata Party. He served as a Cabinet Minister in the Government of Gujarat, holding various portfolios, such as finance, labour and employment, from 1997 to 2012. He was elected to Gujarat Legislative Assembly from Rajkot West constituency multiple times².

The discretionary power vested in the governor especially when no single party was in a position to form ministry in the state is controversial. But in the case of Karnataka, the BJP though, not in a position to form ministry was given special privilege over the post-poll coalition Congress and JD(s) whose combined members cross the required majority for making government. Even though BJP is the single largest party with 104 seats, short of 8 seats to get majority, the Governor ignored a coalition of Congress and JD(s) having 115 (78+37). By inviting the BJP, it opened the door widely for defection and horse trading and seemed out of propriety out rightly.

Then, on 10th April 2018 three non-BJP ruled southern states and Union Territory Puducherry expressed serious reservations on the Terms of Reference (ToR) stipulated by the Centre in the 15th Finance Commission (FC) for devolution of funds to states. At a conclave of finance ministers of southern states in Thiruvananthapuram; Kerala, Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh and Puducherry said that the ToR contradicted the principles of federalism and more non-BJP ruled states would be involved to debate the issue³.

Their complaints centered on two things- first, the 15th FC ToR used 2011 census for population based tax devolution instead of 1971 census. They argue that they were in a disadvantage as they successfully pursued the population control policy from 1971 and regarded it as penalty for their achievement. Secondly, they were concerned about the lesser amount of tax devolution they received in comparison to greater contribution relative to other states to national exchequer. They thought that the Finance Commission would frame the ToR independently, but accused that it was under the control of Union Government in reality. So these Southern Non-BJP states felt this as an unfair treatment meted out by the BJP-led NDA government at the centre.

There may be instances that could be regarded as ill-treatment by these states, but it also may be due to political expediency and exaggeration of regional chauvinistic idea. With regard to their first complaint mentioned above, sticking to the 1971 census and ignoring demographic change means paying no attention to the current population scenario. NK Singh, Chairman of the 15th Finance Commission, said the panel may consider providing incentives to States that have managed to achieve the objective of population control while distributing resources between Centre and States⁴. So, their achievement of population control will not go in vain.

With regard to the second concern also, these states seem to be at fault. If FCs were to distribute the divisible pool of taxes among states matching their contributions to it, ignoring the needs of different states, it would not at all be necessary to have a FC. Framers of the Constitution were well aware of regional disparity in the country, and as such, they made provisions for FCs which would work towards reduction of regional disparity⁵. Those richer states in the northern region of the country also received less from the national divisible tax in comparison to what they contributed. But, India as a federal welfare state needs to commit to regional inclusive economic development and needs give more to the poorer states.

Various factors are working to shape a specific federal state and Indian federalism is also formed out of her specific history, circumstances during the independence and after. Political change after 1967 elections at the centre with the loosing grip of Congress party heralded a shift in centre-state relations. Even with deliberative and cautious works of the framers of constitution on Indian federalism, problems and issues had been emerged as the years had passed.

DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES:

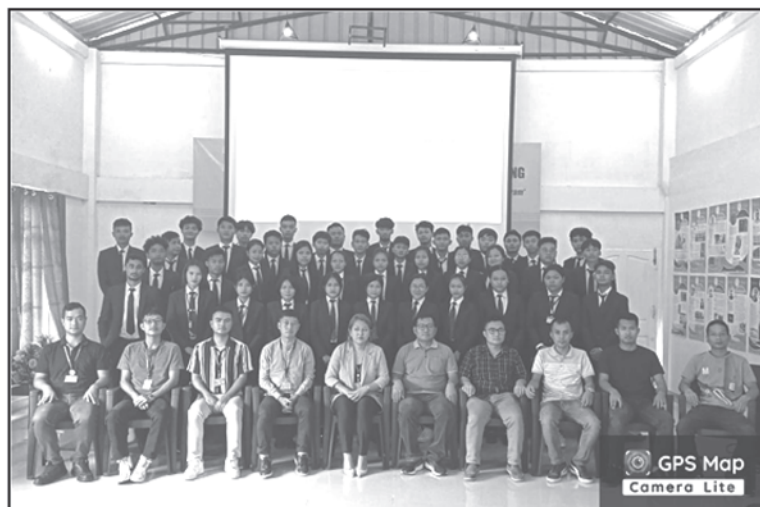

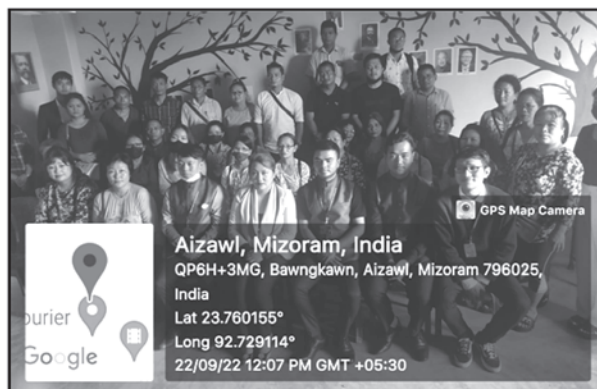
- 2. Visit to Innovation Facility Centre, MINECO:**

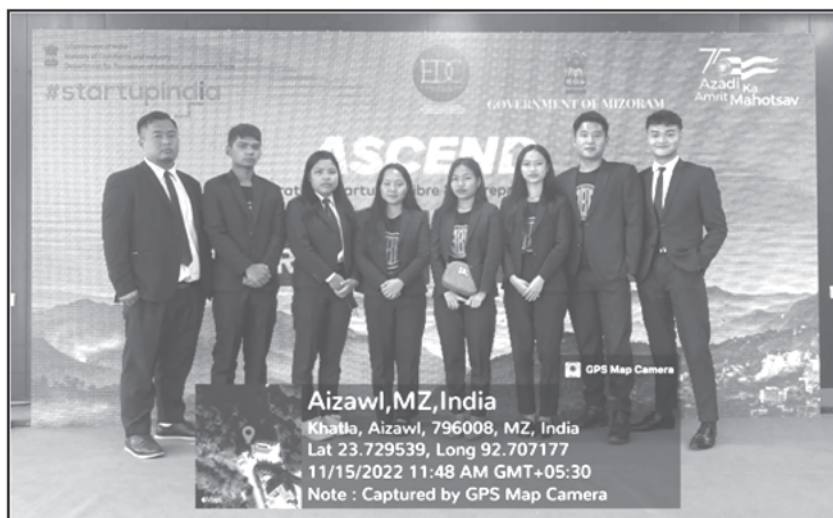
3. Parent Teacher Meet:

7. Annual College Week Champion:

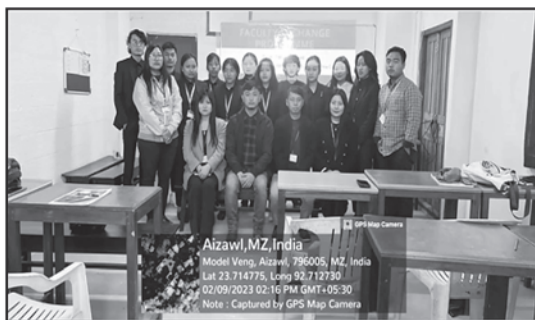
The Department has won the Annual College Week, 2022-2023 which includes a Trophy and Cash prize of Rs2000/-. The Department was also crowned as the Best House.
