

ROLE AND FUNCTIONS OF CENTRAL BOARD OF SECONDARY EDUCATION (CBSE)

Historical Background of CBSE:

A trail of developments marks the significant changes that most place over the years in shaping up the Board to its present status. U.P. Board of High School and Intermediate Education was the first Board set up in 1921. It had under its Jurisdiction Rapputana. Central India and Gwalior. In response to the tepresentation made by the Government of United Provinces, the then Government of India suggested to set up a joint Board in 1929 for all the areas and this was named as the "Board of High School and Intermediate Education, "Rajputana". This included Ajmer, Merwara, Central India and Gwalior.


The Board witnessed rapid growth and expansion at the level of secondary education resulting in improved quality and standard of education in its irratinations. But with the advent of Size Universities and State Board in various parts of the country, the jurisdiction of the board was confined only to Ajance, Bhopal and Vindhya Pradeah later. As a result of this, in 1952, the Continution of the Board was amended wherein its jurisdiction was extended to part C and part D territories and the Board was given its present name "Central Board of Secundary Education (CBSE)". The board was reconstituted in the year 1962. The main objectives were serving the educational institutions more effectively, to be responsive to the characterial needs of those students whose parents were employed in the Central Government and had frequently transferable jobs.

INTER-DISTRICT DEVELOPMENTAL DISPARITY IN MIZORAM ON THE BASIS OF AGRICULTURE AND ALLIED SECTOR

J.V. Nunchunga

One of the foremost important ingredients for economic development is a sustained growth in agricultural production. If we look at the history of economic development of the world, the role of agriculture is empirically established. As such, the tenth Pive Year Plan of India has dightly said, "Agriculture development is central to economic development of the country" (Dutt & Sundraram, 2009). Any change in agriculture sector — positive or negative has a multiplier effect on the routire economy. The agricultural sector acts as a bulwark in maintaining food security and in the process, national security as well. To maintain ecological balance, it has been ingued that "there is a need for sustainable and balanced development of agricultural and allied sectors" (Datt & Sundraram, 2009: 492).

CONTRIBUTION OF AGRICULTURE AND ALLIED SECTOR TO THE GSDP

In times of trouble, a person often loses her/his humanity. This paper will give a comparative study of the role of the 'pointer' in the Mizo and the Naga underground movement. Temsula Ao's collection of short stories These Hills Called Home Stories from a War Zone and Malsawmi Jacob's novel Zorami a Redemption Song and C. Lalawmpuia Vanchiau's Rambuai Literature will be used as primary texts, In his book Rambuai Literature, Lalawinpula raises the question 'Kawktu; Amaha piang nge siamchawp?' (Pointer: Are they inborn or moulded by circumstance?).1 Lalawmpuia Vanchiau brings forth three kinds of pointers during the Mizo insurgency (1966-1986) as:

Pointer A - these people comprise of those who were a part of the underground movement but have betrayed the Mizo independent movement and submitted themselves in the hands of the Indian Army. In their submission they have betrayed their own friends whom they pointed as tebels. For the 'rammu sawrkar' underground government, it is difficult to let go of these pointers. Pointer B - these people were not a part of the underground movement. Pointer Cthey are different from Pointer A and Pointer B. They are usually non-Mizos who live among the Mizos and Chakmas.2




pizoram became the twenty-third state of the Indian Union on 20th February, 1987 (Lalringwina 2005: xix). The Cabolition of the rights of the Mizo Chief in 1954 as it result of a meeting held on 1st October, 1947 was a great step towards the modernisation of the Mizo society. Mizo, being one of the ethnic groups of North East India, has witnessed different phases of cultural change. Colonial modernity in the taser half of the nineteenth century to the first part of the twentieth century brought about immense change in the society. The most significant change was the change from craftly to literacy which further brought about a new cultural identity. This article focuses on the people who have chosen to identify themselves collectively as 'Mizo'. The Mizo language (Duhlian/Luser) nurtured by the Christian missionaries became the common language of Mizoram by the postindependence period. The Mixos are a close-knit community hold together by common traditions, language and culture. The different Mizo tribes and sub-tribes had been scattered before they could be jointly called 'Mizo'. They had migrated to Mizoram, Manipur, North Cachar, Tripura and parts of Burma and Bangladesh (Thanmawia 1998: 15). As a result of this scattered inigration their cultures, traditions and way of living has become different. After the





Youth are times of discovery, emerging feelings, exploration and experimentation of new behaviour and rélationships. It is a period of great stress, confusion and new sensation. Love, sex, marriage and drugs are the major areas which confront youth most frequently. This is a period of maximum sexual drive, this sexual urge can involve risks, and the same is true of experimentation with drugs, legal and illegal. In the absence of right guidance and correct information at this stage they are more likely to have multi-partner unprotected sex with high risk behavior groups. They are confronted with technological advancement like, internet, cyber bullying, smoking and drinking as glamorous and risk-free. The young adult is a period of adjustments to new patterns of life and new social expectations. Today, we see so much of youth unrest, the crime rate and sexual perversion has gone up ruthless exploitation exits. Young people are a force for change because they are young, resilient, open to change, creative and often idealistic.

Youth today are in the shadow of HIV/AIDS and sexually transmitted diseases. Sex and drugs are the modes of transmission of this epidemic. Because of these behaviour youth are especially vulnerable they began experiencing sexual intercourse at an early age. In USA, about half of all adolescents are estimated to be sexually active and their percentages increases to over 80% in some minority groups. Young people between the ages of 15-24 make up the majority of the new HIV infections. There are more than 11.8 million young people below 24 years of age living with HIV/AIDS in the world, of which 7.3 million are young women and 4.5 million are young men (UNAIDS, 1998).

Youth who inject drugs and alcohol and other drugs can affect sexual behavior are exposed to high HIV risks, if they share needles and excessive drinking, diminishes inhibitions and impairs decision making. At the same time, young people are especially vulnerable because of biological and social factors like- Early marriage, Early sex, Lack of necessary knowledge and skills of how to protect themselves from HIV/AIDS, drug injecting, sex trade, low percentage of condom use.







Abstract

The present study is an attempt to find out whether the different provisions of Right to Education Act, 2009 have been effectively implemented in Mizoram based on the perception of the Headmasters, teachers and perents of children in both Gavernment and private elementary schools Out of the eight districts of Mizoram, four districts namely, Aizawl, Lungiei, Champhas and Mamit districts were randomly selected to represent the state for conduct of the present study. Elementary schools in the sample districts were stratified into Government and private schools. A sample of 104 elementary schools comprising of 63 Government and 41 private elementary schools, 520 elementary school teachers consisting of 315 Government and 295 private elementary school teachers by using stratified random sampling method. The study reveals that Right to Education Act. 2009 has not been effectively implemented in Mizoram due to various reasons like shortage of funding, non-rationalization of teachers, powers. lack of infrastructure, insufficient teaching learning equipment, apathy among community members and so on. Many teachers are still not aware of the pertinence of this Act and pay no heed to it. Whereas this Act has both a positive and negative impact on the students and teachers of Government elementary schools, private schools are not much affected by the implementation of this Act.
